



Newcastle Jets Fan Representative Group (FRG)

The Newcastle Jets Fan Representative Group (FRG) has been established by Newcastle Jets Football Club to enable clearer two-way communication between the Club and its fans, as well as providing a formal connection for supporters to the leadership of the Australian Professional Leagues (APL). The FRG will involve a cross-section of the Club's fanbase to ensure that fan voices can be heard and considered in decision-making on key matters.

This group will have a direct line of communication and representation through to the A-League Fan Representative Group, along with all other A-League Club Fan Representative Groups.

PRG Responsibilities:

- Act as a collective voice of the Club's fanbase
- Advise the Club on priority areas and issues requiring focus, and provide recommendations
- Provide constructive feedback and input into any new initiatives to improve fan engagement and experience
- Actively promote and support initiatives in the community that are derived from the FRG

Composition

- Comprised of up to 10 people, representative of all fan groups and segments
- A chair will be agreed between the group and the Club to assist with steering each of the meetings, and also act as the Club's representative at the A-League Fan Representative Group
- The Club CEO and/or Club senior staff will be in attendance at every meeting

Meetings

- Meetings will take place a minimum of three times a year, on dates determined by the Club
- Meetings to be held face-to-face, where possible
- Meeting minutes will be published to all Club Members and shared with APL

Appointments

- All interested parties are to complete the application form by the due date to be considered
- All applications will be reviewed and appointed by a Club panel made up of a cross-section of Senior staff members within the Club
- The term of appointment for any representative on the FRG is for an initial two-year term, and thereafter for a period of one year, with a maximum three-year term per representative
